**SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS:**

Gray's Creek High School opened in August 2003 with a student population of 800. Built to accommodate 1200 students, our current student population is approximately 1100. GCHS offers a comprehensive curriculum to prepare graduates for entry into post-secondary institutions or the work force. Advanced Placement and Honors level courses are available in the academic, career and technical education, and cultural arts curriculum. GCHS employs the 4x4 block schedule, allowing the students to complete four courses each semester. Additional credit can be earned through summer school, Evening Academy, the North Carolina Virtual Public School, and Fayetteville Technical Community College.

**Grading Scale:**
